
ENCOURAGED AND BUILT UP

I'm glad my dad is part of a men's group. While I don't go with him each week, I know I can, even as a teenager. The group, it turns out, wasn't just for my dad...it was for me, too.

You see, a few months ago my parents found out I had been looking at porn. To be honest, neither of them knew exactly how to react. I think my parents were very hurt and I'm sure mad. I was ashamed and clueless what to do next. I was wondering if I would ever be trusted or looked at the same, especially by my mom.

I am thankful that my dad could talk to the men in his small group about it. He could sort through his emotions and get wise counsel from others. The men in the group are praying for me and one of the men has begun mentoring me. My mentor, and dad's Journey group member, has also helped me be more transparent with my family by encouraging me to get and share a Covenant
