For the last six years, I have had the privilege of coaching kids in flag football through sports programs put on by two of our neighbor churches – Calvary Church's CHAMP Sports Outreach and First Baptist Indian Trail's 316 Sports.

Through these programs, I am able to be a servant of the gospel, serving boys and girls (yes, it's not just a boy's club) from 8 to 11 years old. I teach them what I call "actual football," running plays that they will see watching (or playing) in high school, college, and the NFL.

We practice hard, we play hard and we compete. While the leagues are recreational at their core, the score is kept, so the kids want to play hard and play to win. It's my job to help them learn and maintain that balance of wanting to win and wanting to win at all costs.
